An Encouraging Word

It can be easily forgotten, but God is the one who brought Christmas into being. And what God does, He does with purpose. So, what is the purpose of Christmas? Bringing a sense of excitement and wonder to children? Time off work? Family gatherings? Giving gifts? Showing appreciation? Or, those "magical" Hallmark moments? These are good things but they're not what God purposed. The purpose of Christmas is that God came to give. He gave Himself to us. It would be hard to relate to God if we only knew Him as God in heaven. But we don't have to struggle with that. Because at Christmas God came to earth in a human form so we could know Him better as Savior and Lord. He came to make the point that you and I matter to Him.

Considering all the things that you may feel have been taken away in 2020, refocusing on Christmas as being about God coming to give is a thought that might be welcomed now more than ever. Have losses this year caused you to question if you matter to God?

"In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken...and everyone went to their own town to register" (Luke 2:1 & 3). It's likely that you have either read these words or have heard them read more than once at Christmas time. However, it's easy to miss what the described events meant to Mary and Joseph. These words meant that they lost any chance of THEIR plans working out at all. Because now this new husband and expectant wife had to leave their home and travel miles to the town of Bethlehem where Joseph's family was from. They had no choice. It was mandated by the government. Imagine the loss Mary and Joseph felt! Mary's baby was due to be born and they had to leave home. And not just any baby, but the baby the angel Gabriel announced to the virgin Mary. A baby who was the Son of the Most High, Jesus the Savior. Being forced to leave home at a time like that had to feel like a loss for Mary and Joseph! Because of that they probably questioned if they mattered to God. Later Mary and Joseph realized that God was had been at work through their loss moving them to Bethlehem where He would fulfill His purpose of Jesus being born there (Micah 5:2). God did have a purpose for their lives. They did matter to God even when it didn't feel like it. God has a purpose for your and my life too. And we matter to God even when it doesn't feel like it. We matter so much that God came near in the person of Jesus to offer us the gift of salvation from sin and the gift of a right faith relationship with Him. A relationship of sacrificial love. Resulting in the trust that He can even use our losses for His greater purposes. Keep that in mind regardless of what may have been a part of your 2020.



For the ere at Mt. Nebo UMC, there are several opportunities to be part of an adult small discipleship group. What is a discipleship group? It is a small group of people who read together, pray together and meet together to become the love of God for one another. Scripture has much to say about spiritual

friendships. In both the Old and New Testaments, scripture affirms the value of developing such relationships with others in small groups. *"Iron sharpens iron, and one man sharpens another"*. Proverbs 27:17 In Hebrews 10:24-25 we find this message- *"And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near."*

* 7:00 PM Wednesday, Heart to Heart Women's Group meeting in the church narthex (Elise Starkey, leader)


If these times or days will not work for you and you feel God is calling you to be part of a small group study, please let me know. Even in these times of social distance and pandemic, two new groups formed in 2020.



We will all miss celebrating the upcoming holidays together but will look forward to the New Year and our Prime Timer Fellowship events. In the mean time stay safe and well.


