


An Encouraging Word

What were you doing January and February of 2020? I was rehabbing from shoulder surgery with 2 day-a-week physical therapy sessions. I thought that was a big disruption but it turned out to be small compared to the disruption the world experienced from COVID-19 by late March of the same year. Travel plans were disrupted. Employment and paychecks were disrupted. Education was disrupted. Family connections were disrupted. Friendships were disrupted. Social gatherings were disrupted. Healthcare was disrupted. Businesses were disrupted. Supply chains were disrupted. Local, state and federal government agencies were dis-

rupted. Worship services were disrupted. And the disruptions continue today to varying degrees.

Disruptions! We'd rather that life not include them. But let me remind us of something Jesus said to people who believed in Him. From John 16:33b "In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." Disruptions and the trouble that comes from them are to be expected. However, so is the overcoming of them. Jesus said to be encouraged about that. Expect his encouragement and disruptions can become the way that we find the way forward.

Sunday, January 16th, I'll begin to preach a series I've titled "Disruptions: And God's Amazing Way Forward."




Habits: Six Healthy Habits to Live By


Family nights are designed for those families with children preschool, elementary age, and beyond.


Printed forms will be available at the Sign Up table in the Narthex.

We plan to discuss ideas that you may have for any future events or just plan an occasional fellowship gathering.




