## An Encouraging Word

lise and I will be married 37 years this March. As a result, we A know each other pretty well. We can tell you about our preferred: colors, style of clothing, food, books, work, hobbies, etc. We're even pretty good at telling you how the other one will finish the sentences they start! The danger of course is that we can fail to completely listen to each other because we assume we know how the conversation will conclude. We end up hearing but we don't hear. In cases like these, the issue isn't a physical loss of hearing it's a case of hearing but not listening. Sometimes Elise or I will hear only the first part of what the other says and then finish their sentence with "Yeah, I know...".

We can do this with Jesus, the Son of God, too. The more time that has passed since we repented of our sin and yielded our lives to His authority, the more likely this is to happen. We become so familiar with His words in the New Testament that it's common to

read them or hear them but not really listen to Jesus speaking to us. We only get part of what He is saying because we have more or less said in our hearts "Yeah, I know...".

The church season of Lent is a great opportunity to change this and become real listeners. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday. It includes the forty days and six Sundays leading up to Easter Sunday. It's a great time to think about our relationship with Jesus. Are we growing in that relationship? Or, are we drifting? If we find ourselves drifting away from Jesus, we can choose to do something about it...listen to Him. One key to growing closer to Jesus is to stop saying "Yeah, I know" and instead choose to read Scripture and really listen to Him.

What might Jesus want to say to you and me? I encourage you to read through Mark and Luke and pay particular attention to the words of Jesus. There's a total of 40 chapters in these two gospels, one for each day of the Lenten season. Choose to listen to Him as you read. Make it a point not to listen with a "Yeah, I know" mindset. Instead, write down the significant things you hear for the purpose of making them your plan of action!




beautiful red rose and the guys enjoyed the candy table decorations.


