rookie pastor was really nervous as he stood before the congregation to give his first sermon. All eyes focused on him and silence fell over the church. He'd worked hard and even memorized what would be his first sermon. As he made eye contact with the people, all of a sudden, he realized he'd forgotten every word. He began to stutter and stammer but finally he spit out these words: "When I came today, my sermon was known only to me and God. Now only God knows."

Have you ever had a memory lapse similar like that? It's an awful feeling to stand before people ready to speak and then forget what you were going to say. Every day

you and I stand before people with a message God has given us to share! Anyone with a personal relationship with the Lord Jesus represents Him through their words and their actions. God's desire is that the people we stand before come to know His Son Jesus as they see the life-impact He's had on us. Our words and actions that grow out of our day to day relationship with Him are called ministry. Ministry is what we do and say in Jesus' name. Or said another way, on His behalf. Ministry things are the things that Jesus would do if He lived in our homes, if He lived in our community, worked where we work, went to school where we go to school, or attended the church we attend. Ministry is meeting needs in a compassionate and practical way. And it's accompanied by humble, heart-felt words pointing people back to the Lord Jesus. Because He's the one who has changed and given us a right relationship with Him. And not just us. He also changes everyone who believes in Him.

Mt. Nebo Church, **if only God knew** what you and I were supposed to do and say, it would be awful! But I'm glad that isn't the case. Because **we do know** that we stand before people with both God and them on our minds. Ministry is on our minds. You haven't forgotten! Well done! Let's keep living out our mission together. The mission "To Know Christ and Make Him Known." Remembering this will make for a real good Easter!

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on **Ash Wednesday** and ends on Holy Saturday (the day before Easter). Lent comes from the Anglo-Saxon word *lencten*, meaning "lengthen" and refers to the lengthening days of spring. The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry.

Lent is meant to be a time of repentance. **Repentance is not a feeling of shame but an awareness that sin separates us from God and of what it cost Him to be reunited with us (His Son).** Shame has its place, but feeling shame over sin is not the same thing as repentance from sin.

Repentant sinners come to God asking for cleansing from sin, but also freedom from shame. True repentance leads to a 180-degree change of direction, requires real brokenness, but repentance starts with the regretful acknowledgment of sin with commitment to change.

That is why confusing Lent with New Year's resolutions is dangerous. This time of fasting should not be used to spiritualize a difficult goal: to lose weight, stop watching pornography, or to give money to charity. Lent is an opportunity to contemplate what our Lord really did for us on the cross. Then, we have the opportunity to renew our commitment to honor Jesus through growing, loving, obedience to Him.
