"Holy Night" will be the preaching theme for Advent and Christmas this year at Mt. Nebo Global Methodist Church. Most all of you will know what I'm referring to by the words "Holy Night." It's the common description of the time that Jesus was born. One of the Christmas hymns is even titled "O, Holy Night." Was He born at night? The gospel of Luke only tells us this in chapter 2 verses 6-7, "While they were there (Bethlehem), the time came for the baby to be born, and she (Mary) gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped Him in cloths and placed Him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them." So, the Bible doesn't

say if the Son of God was born at night. However, God did send angels to make a nighttime announcement of Jesus' birth to a group of shepherds staying with their sheep in an open field near Bethlehem. That's likely where the idea originated that Jesus was born at night but we don't know for sure He was born at night. Yet we do know that it was a holy time because God chose to come near to the people of earth that He created. In fact, God spoke through the Old Testament prophet Isaiah to foretell how He would come. Isaiah 7:14, "The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel (which means "God with us"). So, the birth of Jesus was definitely a holy time whether it was during the day or night.

How would you define the word "holy" as I used it in the previous paragraph? We could use many words to try to define it. And all of them would be our attempts at describing God. The birth of Jesus was a holy time because He was God! He was God who came to our sin-sick world with the antidote to cure us. He came to give His life to save us from the guilt, shame, and power of our sin. Jesus came to do that for every person who will turn away from their sin and dare to believe He has a new life for them to live in relationship with Him. Thirty plus years after His birth, He allowed His body to be beaten and broken to make us whole. And He allowed His blood to be shed dying on a cross to give us a new life to live. The birth of Jesus was a holy time! Celebrate Him day and night this Christmas!




Rev. John Kalambo Visits Mount Nebo

Jared Cornett passed away September 9, 2024, at the age of 50. Jared was the son of Pat Cornett and will be greatly missed.


Petrina Brown passed away September 12, 2024, at the age of 50. Petrina was the daughter-in-law of Andra Brown and will be greatly missed.

Carole Arn passed away October 4, 2024, at the age of 81. Carole was the mother of David (Shelly) Arn and will be greatly missed.





candles that each represent a week in Advent also signify hope, peace, joy and love. (The third candle is often pink.) In the center is the white Christ candle, representing Jesus as the light of the world. That candle is lit on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day. The round, green Advent wreath has special meaning of its own. It symbolizes eternal life and the unending love of God, who sent his only Son to earth to die in our place.


