Most of you reading this are probably aware of my decision to retire this year at the end of June. My wife, Elise, and I have been talking about this and praying about this for some months. The reason is that I haven't been able to regain the energy and clarity that I need to serve God with my best in pastoral ministry. Some of it is probably age but most of it is due to the lingering effects of an August 2, 2024 car crash in which Elise and I were involved. I want you to know that I'm okay with retiring now because I'm completely confident that it's a God-directed change. I have shared with Mt. Nebo's Leadership Team for a few years now that I've been praying for the Lord to let me know when it

was time to step aside. Now is clearly the time and the Holy Spirit is giving both of us peace. However, I know that change isn't easy and all of us will need to make adjustments. Change does bring a degree of uncertainty about what is ahead. Yet when we love and follow Jesus, we can be certain that He will cause all things to work together for our good (Romans 8:28) and His glory.

You may be wondering about the process for identifying Mt. Nebo's next lead pastor. The process for pastoral change in the Global Methodist Church is very different from the process of our former denomination. It works like this. Our Staff-Parish Relations Committee, and a SPRC sub-group have worked together to compile a church profile. This profile was submitted to our Hillsboro Circuit Presiding Elder, Rev. Dennis Mohler, who is helping to guide our SPRC group through the search process. Rev. Mohler shared Mt. Nebo's profile with the Conference Superintendent and the other Presiding Elders in our Allegheny West Annual Conference

together to identify 2 to 3 prospective experienced Ordained Elders (pastors) who are open to considering Mt. Nebo as a potential place to serve God. Next, Rev. Mohler presented our SPRC group with profiles of prospective pastors. An initial virtual interview is conducted. If our SPRC group wants to consider a second interview with one of the prospective pastors, a face to face interview is arranged by Rev. Mohler. If none of pastors considered seem to be a fit for Mt. Nebo, our SPRC group requests interviews with additional prospective pastors. Once the SPRC group identifies Mt. Nebo's next lead pastor, the SPRC group and Leadership Team will vote together. Afterwards, the congregation will be informed as soon as possible. I ask you to continue to pray for everyone involved that God's good will is realized.

I said earlier that I'm completely confident now is the right time for me to step aside. And because God has given me this certainty, we can be confident that He has a person prepared to lead Mt. Nebo forward in mission and ministry. Let me remind you of our mission: "To make disciples of Jesus Christ who worship passionately, love extravagantly, and witness boldly". I want you to be excited for what God has ahead for Mt. Nebo. I get it. Changes like this are not easy. But in order for the Holy Spirit to move the church forward, it requires followers of Jesus who are willing to change as He directs us to change. Mt. Nebo has a 190-year history that includes stories of God-directed changes that have resulted in many people being saved and changed through faith in Jesus. He has changed individuals, whole families, and even this community through the people of Mt. Nebo Church. People who were willing to change in order to keep moving forward to share the gospel of Jesus!

I'm excited for you! I'm excited about what God has ahead for you and for me and my family too. The adjustments will be a challenge for all of us for a while but remember the promise of Jesus to those who with courage and faith will take on His mission. He said, "I have been given all authority in heaven and on earth. Therefore, go and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:18-20 NLT). Notice that this promise is dependent on you and me going and making disciples. Keep moving forward to share the good news about Jesus and to love people on His behalf.

Following Jesus is an adventure! An adventure that we were created to sign onto. So, congregation, I encourage you to keep moving forward with courage and faith expecting God to do greater things and changing more lives in the years ahead.



here are Sunday School classes at Mt. Nebo that meet year-round between the 9 AM and 11 AM Worship Services. For children, this is a great opportunity to learn



more about Jesus and His Love as well as learn how to read the Bible. Maybe as a child, this is where you learned the Lord's Prayer, Ten Commandments, and precious Bible stories from both the Old and New Testaments. For teens, this is a time to meet together with peers to learn and grow in relationship to Christ and one another; lessons for this age include life application components.

For many adults, the Sunday school hour is a time you can commit to being part of a small group. Our adult small groups, in addition to studying, watch over one another in Christian love.

Children and Youth Classes Age 4- High School

- Age 4 through 2nd grade meet each Sunday in the nursery, using Heart Shaper curriculum. Kristina Waterfield is the teacher of that group.
- Grades 3 through 6 meet in Classroom 1. This group also uses the Heart Shaper curriculum, specifically designed for this age range. Carol Ann King teaches this group.
- Grades 7 and 8 meet in the church kitchen. This group is taught by Kristine Brookover and uses a Jr. High Heart Shapers curriculum.
- High Schoolers meet each Sunday in Classroom 2. Jacob Clubb teaches the group, which uses a Biblically based curriculum with real-life applications for today's teens.

Adult Sunday School Classes

- Prayer and Share Class- Meets in the Admin Building. This group is led by Joe Chirco.
 The format is easy to follow- share praises and prayer requests- Study together (presently using study by Bob Goff), sending out to serve throughout the week.
- Adult Study Group- Meets in Classroom 3. This group is presently using *Glory Days*, a video- study guide by Max Lucado. Learn and grow together in Christ.

Reaching Across The World

Through the Youth's Hearted for Zambia project, Mt. Nebo has had the opportunity to reach out to our ministry partner in Zambia, Pastor John Kalambo. During February through mid March, the youth hearted yards



to raise awareness and funds for JP Schools, a ministry that Pastor Kalambo has begun in a community in Zambia. Throughout this time, the congregation and friends of Mt. Nebo willingly allowed their yards to be hearted and donated money to move the hearts to another yard. Many of you, who did not even have the opportunity to see hearts appear in your yard, gave both time to pray as well as financial donations to support JP Schools.

The youth were able to connect and talk with Pastor Kalambo via Zoom, both at the beginning and end of this time. It was because of your generosity through Hearted for Zambia that \$2,985 was sent to Pastor Kalambo for JP Schools toward the end of March. The youth are going to continue to pray and partner with Pastor Kalambo and JP Schools in the coming months, won't you join the youth in praying for them regularly this summer!




