The average is typically where we're able to fit in with others. It's the safe place where a person doesn't draw negative attention. Therefore, average can be the comfortable place.

Following Jesus is different. His life wasn't average and He didn't encourage His followers to live average lives. He didn't encourage us to make finding the safe or comfortable place our goal in life. Instead, Jesus said this:

"...I tell you, whoever believes in Me will do the works I have been doing, and they will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father." John 14:12

Jesus said His followers would do greater things. Not only the average religious things. Instead, greater things because He returned to His Father and sent the Holy Spirit to fill our lives. In John 14:17 Jesus said, "...you know Him, for He lives with you and will be in you." These greater things are supposed to be the authentic experience of every follower of Jesus. And this can be our experience when we allow the Holy Spirit to more completely have and empower our lives. God wants to work through our Holy Spirit filled lives to help the lost, broken, hurting world around us to experience Jesus. May God use the Gospel of Mark and the sermon series "From Average to Authentic" to move the needle of the Holy Spirit in our lives further to the authentic side. 


