What's the best way to get to know someone?

Rely on first impressions? Nope because we can easily misjudge them. The first impression that some of our neighbors had of me was me in dirty work clothes or driving my 20 year old rusted out truck. First impressions are seldom accurate.

Ask somebody else who says they know them? Equally inaccurate because they may not know the person well or they may have the wrong impression of them. All some people heard about me at first was that I was a pastor. Therefore, any negative experience they may have had with other pastors was probably transferred onto me...Yikes!

Use a Google search? Also, likely to be inaccurate. Because what they find may be information about another person by the same name. I Google searched my name and found 156 Mike Starkeys not counting a greater or equal amount of Michael Starkeys.

The best way to get to know someone is for them to choose to open up and share about themselves...reveal themselves to us.

God created us to be in a right relationship with Him. God loves us and wants us to know Him well. Therefore, He has chosen to reveal Himself to humankind since the beginning. One way God has done this is through using different names that describe His character. And as we discover more about God's character, we have the opportunity to get to know Him better, trust Him more and love Him more deeply. [Psalm 9:10] "And those who know Your name will put their trust in You, for You O Lord, have not forsaken those who seek You."

Drive-Thru Backpack Event—On August 4th, the backpack school supply transitioned to a drive-thru format, but students were still able to pick their favorite backpack (already filled with supplies for the school year) from their cars. Children, youth, and adults from the four churches worked together to make sure kids had the backpacks they wanted. In all, there were 151 filled backpacks given to families that evening and another 30 were donated to the Hamersville Elementary/Middle school to be distributed to those needing them throughout the year.



Jericho Prayer Walk—The four churches came together the day before students started school for the 2020-2021 school year. This time the purpose was to pray for the upcoming school year as they walked the grounds. Prayers for students, staff, community health, essential workers and those making decisions related to schools safely reopening were prayed as people walked around district buildings.






Celebrate Summer



The Sky Was Falling!

he sky was falling on the evening of April 8, 2020, when a severe thunderstorm produce high wind and large hail. When our Leadership Team had the church building roofs inspected a few months later, significant hail damage was discovered. We contacted our insurance company and they sent out an adjuster who determined that the damage warranted that all our shingle roofs

be replaced, four buildings in all. Myself and the Leadership Team Members cringed at the thought of what Mt. Nebo's part of the cost might be. Individually we were praying that God would provide somehow for this unexpected need and expense. However, we had no idea how well God would provide to help us continue to carry out our mission: To Know Christ and Make Him Known." God's provision came in three parts. First, our church insurance policy includes full replacement value coverage which meant that 100% of the cost is covered minus our deductible. God definitely provided for this need. Second, we later learned that our insurance company even cut the deductible in half. Third, Robert Morgan, the contractor we hired, made a donation to Mt. Nebo which will cover the deductible and then some. We are grateful to God for meeting our need and we are grateful for our insurance company and Robert Morgan who were willing parts of it. The roofing work will likely begin soon after Labor Day. Please join myself and our Leadership Team in offering sincere praise to God for providing for ministry at Mt. Nebo in ways that we could not have imagined.


